

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 November 2025 the provider notified us that there had been an incident in relation to meeting children's allergy needs. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 23 January 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. The provider had taken action to address this. This included carrying out a full review of allergy management procedures and providing refresher training to staff on policies relating to allergen controls. Additionally, the provider also strengthened oversight of mealtimes to ensure children's dietary needs are consistently met and safer eating procedures are being followed.

On 16 January 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to information and record keeping. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 23 January 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. Following the identification of a data protection breach at head office, the provider took immediate action to address this. The provider notified the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) and acted on their guidance. This included reviewing data handling procedures, strengthening controls to reduce the risk of further breaches, and checking all records to ensure that no further

breaches had occurred.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
