

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 09 September 2024, the provider notified us about an incident that had taken place relating to child supervision.

On 19 September 2024, the provider made a further unrelated notification regarding a safeguarding issue.

These notifications mean that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' to notify Ofsted of significant incidents and events.

The notifications raised concerns that all requirements were not being met.

On 10 October 2024, we spoke to the provider by telephone. We found that there had been breaches of requirement relating to both notifications, but the provider had already taken action to put matters right. The improvements made included implementing more robust procedures for supervising children when moving around the building and providing additional safeguarding training for relevant staff. We were satisfied with the action taken to meet requirements.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
