

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 4 July 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding policies and procedures and Information and record keeping. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of matters affecting the welfare of children.

On 18 August 2025, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has implemented new processes to ensure information and records about children are obtained and shared with other settings that children attend. The provider has also put appropriate and additional supervision measures in place for children who may require additional support during their time at the provision.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
