

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 1 May 2025, the provider notified us of an incident that occurred at the setting. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant events. The notification raised concerns relating to safeguarding policies and procedures, safeguarding training, accident or injury, risk assessment, complaints, medicine and changes that must be notified to Ofsted

On 23 May 2025 we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have issued an action for the provider to take within the timescales set out below. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 6 June 2025:

ensure that the designated safeguarding leads have sufficient knowledge and understanding of the procedures to follow in the event of an allegation made against staff, in line with the local safeguarding partnership's procedures and the nursery's policy and procedures.

On 5 June 2025 the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider has supported staff to improve their knowledge and understanding of safeguarding practice. Designated safeguarding leads have refreshed their knowledge. In addition, they are booked on relevant safeguarding training to ensure they are clear on their roles and responsibilities

of the procedures to take should an allegation be made against staff. The provider has reviewed their safeguarding policy and procedures. They have trained and coached all staff to improve their knowledge and understanding of the settings processes should they have a concern about staff practice or a child's welfare.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
