## Summary of key findings

### This provision meets requirements

- Leaders discuss how they identify when children need additional support. They confidently describe how they assess children's needs before planning how to deploy staff. Leaders explain this helps children to receive the attention they need to understand and join in with activities.
- Leaders understand how to provide inclusive care for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). They understand that creating activities that consider children's individual needs is important. Leaders discuss how this ensures that staff know how to plan activities that are appropriate for all children.
- Leaders understand that it is important to communicate effectively with parents and carers. They demonstrate an understanding of how to support parents to access services from external professionals. Leaders discuss how creating activities that children enjoy helps them to feel motivated to join in.
- Staff know that it is important to work with external partners to support children. They discuss how they hold meetings with parents to identify any additional support that children need. Staff understand how to work in partnership with schools and the local authority to ensure that children receive the care they need to enjoy the club.
- Leaders demonstrate a strong understanding of how to promote positive behaviour. They describe how they create opportunities for children to gain social skills with others. Leaders train staff to understand when children need additional support to regulate their feelings. They understand that this helps children to feel safe and happy.
- Leaders recognise the importance of healthy lifestyles. They know how to work with external agencies to support disadvantaged children. Leaders describe how they provide children with healthy foods. They explain how they support children to develop life skills, such as cooking. Leaders discuss how this promotes children's physical health and well-being.
- Leaders know how to support staff. They describe how they help them to understand their roles through regular training. Leaders explain how they take feedback from staff to help them to identify gaps in their knowledge. They recognise this helps staff to continue to develop their skills over time.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
