Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders can explain the curriculum aims and how this prepares children for school. They can identify activities that will support children to develop their early communication skills, such as singing and reading stories. Leaders demonstrate knowledge of how they will plan experiences for children. This includes using children's interests to support individual progress. Leaders recognise that children develop at their own pace. They explain how the curriculum will be adapted to meet the needs of all children, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND).
- Leaders discuss the nursery's approach to behaviour management. They show how to role model good manners and how to teach children about expected behaviour. They describe strategies to support children to learn to take turns. Leaders describe how they will guide children to understand differences so all children can feel included.
- Leaders describe how they will collect information about children before they start at the nursery. They understand how to use this to help children to settle. Leaders describe how the daily routine will support children to develop independence skills. The outdoor space is designed to give opportunities for active and risky play. Leaders discuss how the nursery menu will provide children with a range of healthy foods.
- Leaders recognise the importance of developing positive relationships with parents. This includes sharing children's progress and home learning ideas. Leaders have experience of supporting parents to work with external agencies and explain how they will access SEND related funding.
- The nursery has suitable premises to meet the needs of children. This includes designated space for different age groups. Leaders demonstrate how they will assess risks and describe the policies they have in place to keep children safe. For example, leaders explain how the nursery staff will safely administer medicine and record accidents.
- Leaders attend training regularly. They explain how this will support professional development and helps keep their knowledge up to date. Leaders understand the importance of staff training to support teaching and care practices. They talk about how they will support staff well-being. Leaders have a network of professionals they can contact for advice.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- Leaders provided documentation to demonstrate the suitability of staff.
- The inspector had discussions with the manager about her understanding of how to safeguard children.
- The inspector viewed a sample of key documentation provided on request.
