## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager understands his role to protect children from harm. He ensures staff are familiar with the procedures to safeguard children and keep them safe. This includes following appropriate policies and procedures, such as for dealing with any accidents or injuries, and undertaking risk assessments.
- The manager understands the importance of making sure staff are well supported in their roles. For example, he offers regular supervision and staff have access to continuing professional development opportunities, including paediatric first-aid training.
- The manager knows how to support children to stay healthy. For example, he recognises the importance of providing regular opportunities for children to play outdoors and develop their physical skills.
- The manager values the importance of self-evaluation to maintain standards. He seeks the reviews of others, such as parents, children and staff to help improve the provision further.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the manager and staff present.
- The inspector checked evidence of the suitability of staff members and discussed the support and training available.
- The inspector looked at the space available for the children, indoors and outdoors, and discussed the equipment and resources available.
- The inspector looked at policies and documents the provider intends to use when caring for children.

Kids Hayward Adventure Playground registered in 2004. It offers out-of-school provision, primarily for children who have special educational needs and disabilities. It is situated in the London Borough of Islington. The setting offers afterschool sessions each weekday from 3.30pm to 5.30pm, and a holiday play scheme operate from 10.15am to 3.15pm. The setting employs four permanent members of staff, all of whom hold appropriate early years qualifications. The setting also employs a number of temporary staff. At the time of the inspection, there were no early years children present.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
