Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders understand the importance of establishing clear routines to encourage children's behaviour and personal well-being. They describe how staff support children to share and take turns and model positive behaviour to them. They explain how staff will build bonds with children and help them understand and reflect on their own emotions and play well with others.
- Leaders demonstrate an understanding of how to promote children's good health. They know the importance of providing children with a choice of nourishing snacks based on considered nutritional guidance and regular access to fresh drinking water. They explain how they provide children with frequent opportunities for healthy exercise, including the daily walk from their school to the club's premises.
- Leaders have a suitable understanding of the importance of working in partnership with the school children attend and other professional agencies to ensure children are safe and cared for. They explain how they will refer any safeguarding concerns about children without delay. Leaders have procedures in place to ensure that staff are suitable to work with children. There are clear and comprehensive policies and procedures to support an open and positive culture of safeguarding.
- Leaders demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the importance of gathering information from parents on children's needs and interests when they join the club. This includes information on children's allergies and medical needs to support their health and well-being. Leaders know how to use information on children's interests to help them settle into the life of the club and enjoy a broad range of activities.
- Leaders demonstrate that they reflect on the quality of their provision and plan for future developments. They understand the importance of providing training and support to all staff to provide high-quality provision. For example, all staff receive paediatric first aid and food hygiene training to ensure children's safety and well-being.
- Leaders plan a wide range of activities to encourage children's curiosity, physical play and creative activity. They liaise closely with the children's school to reflect the topics and themes children are learning at school, such as 'All About Me' or 'People who help us'.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
