Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- There are exceptionally close relationships between the club staff and school staff. This enables extensive information sharing about children and their needs. Staff at the club know children extremely well. If children have special educational needs and/or disabilities or need additional support, the manager identifies exactly what support the club needs to provide. Consequently, the manager and staff demonstrate how they meet the needs of all children at the club effectively.
- The flexible timetable of activities encourages children to make choices about what they want to play with. There are activity sessions, such as gymnastics and football, to encourage children to be physically active. This helps to contribute towards their healthy lifestyles.
- Children can access the 'Thrive' room during their time at the club. This offers them a quiet space, where they can play with staff and talk about how they feel. The manager explains how this is beneficial for children's mental health and well-being.
- Staff understand about how to support children's good behaviour. Older children talk about how to behave in a positive manner and explain what the club rules are.
- Through discussions, staff explain how they support young children through the key-person arrangements. Staff who work at the club also work within the school. As a result, staff are familiar for children. Staff explain how this helps children to settle quickly at the club.
- Staff form good relationships with parents. Detailed information is shared with parents via the club website. Therefore, parents know about the activities that children can take part in at the club.
- The manager and staff demonstrate a good understanding of safeguarding matters. There are robust recruitment procedures for staff and they understand their responsibilities to identify and share any concerns about children's well-being. The manager has a good awareness of how to refer any concerns about children's welfare to the relevant safeguarding partners.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- This was the first routine inspection the provider received since the COVID-19 pandemic began. The inspector discussed the impact of the pandemic with the provider and has taken that into account in their evaluation of the provider.
- The inspector spoke to older children about the activities and their experiences at the club.
- A meeting was held with the manager of the club and the inspector held discussions with staff and the school headteacher.
- The inspector looked at required documentation and discussed measures in place to confirm the suitability of staff at the setting.
- The manager showed the inspector around the club and discussed how the club supports children.

We carried out this inspection under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.

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
