Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders have a clear understanding of their roles and responsibilities in protecting children from harm. They ensure that staff receive regular training to help them quickly identify the signs and symptoms of abuse. Staff can confidently explain the actions they must take if they have any concerns about a child's well-being.
- Leaders are committed to providing an inclusive environment, where all children, including those with special educational needs and/or disabilities, feel welcomed and supported. They acknowledge the importance of working in partnership with parents and staff at other settings that children attend to help ensure consistency in their care.
- Leaders recognise the importance of providing children with healthy, nutritious meals and ensuring they have opportunities to be physically active to support their overall health and well-being.
- Leaders and staff have a clear understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements. They carry out regular risk assessments indoors and outdoors to maintain a safe and secure environment for children. They acknowledge the importance of supervising children, including when they are eating.
- Leaders are aware of the importance of setting clear rules and boundaries to guide children's behaviour. They demonstrate a strong knowledge of positive behaviour management strategies and recognise their role in teaching children to value and respect others.
- Robust recruitment, induction and staff training procedures are in place. Leaders are committed to ensuring that staff keep their knowledge and skills up to date. For example, staff attend regular training to guide and improve their practice.
- Leaders ensure they provide a good range of good-quality play resources that are suitable for the range of children attending.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
