

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at <http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2>. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 11 January 2024, the provider notified us of a significant event. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 10 April 2024, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The setting's induction procedures have since been improved and leaders now ensure that suitably experienced staff work with children under two. However, we found that the provider was not meeting some other requirements. Leaders do not ensure that staff receive adequate supervision which provides opportunity for support, coaching and training to promote the interests of children. We have issued an action for the provider to take within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 1 May 2024:

- Leaders to ensure that all staff receive supervision that provides opportunities for support, coaching and training which promotes the interests of children.

On 1 May 2024, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider had reviewed their procedures to ensure that all staff receive ongoing supervision that will offer support, coaching and training. This will promote the interests of children. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

On 23 May 2024, we carried out a further regulatory visit due to Ofsted receiving additional concerns that the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We issued an action for the provider to take within the timescale set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 7 June 2024:

- Ensure risk assessment informs staff practice to identify and remove risks to children through regular checks of the environment.

On 6 June 2024, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider had reviewed their procedures to ensure that all staff use risk assessment to inform their practice. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
