

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right. On 10 December 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding policies and procedures. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 18 February 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Actions needed by 4 March 2026:

- strengthen policies and procedures for managing allegations against staff by ensuring they contain clear reporting routes, defined roles and responsibilities, set timescales, and are fully understood by all staff
- ensure that staff who hold key roles particularly in safeguarding matters have a thorough understanding of their role and responsibilities.

On 03 March 2026, the provider responded to the action set. We found that the provider has taken steps to strengthen procedures for managing allegations against staff and to ensure safeguarding leaders have a secure and thorough understanding of their roles and responsibilities. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare action raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

On 05 March 2026, the provider notified us of a significant incident (Staff: child ratio). This means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 11 March 2026, we carried out a regulatory telephone call and found that at the time of the incident the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. The provider has taken steps to put this right. They have reviewed and improved the settings policies and procedures, improved communication with the staff team during periods of transitions and

refreshed safeguarding training. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
