

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 10 March and 11 May 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to staff:child ratios, safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment and qualifications, training, support and skills. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 3 July 2025, we conducted a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has reminded staff of the settings risk assessments. In addition, leaders have reminded staff of the importance of carrying out headcounts. Particularly, as they move children between rooms and to and from the outdoor play areas. This means staff know and understand their roles and responsibilities in keeping children safe. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
