Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders have taken effective action to improve the provision since the last inspection and ensure requirements are met. They describe clear arrangements in place for regular quality checks and day-to-day monitoring of staff practice. They explain that, alongside this, staff have regular supervision meetings and access to professional development opportunities, in order to extend their skills.
- Staff show an understanding of how to ensure children are cared for in a safe environment. For example, they explain that they follow careful routines for collecting children after school. They make sure that children remain inside until all the gates at the school have been locked. They explain how they supervise children all the time. For example, they make sure there is always a staff member in each room being used and outside.
- Staff understand how to provide a range of activities for children to occupy them at the end of the school day. For example, they talk about how they offer creative activities, games and books as well as access to the school playground for outdoor play. They explain they use topics and themes that they can adapt according to the age of the children taking part.
- Leaders and staff describe how they make sure they find out about children's needs and interests before they start at the setting. For instance, they explain that they ask parents to fill in registration forms and have arrangements in place to work in partnership with the school. They describe how they make adjustments to ensure they can include any children with special educational needs and/or disabilities.
- Staff show an understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. They describe how they encourage children to be respectful and kind. Staff explain how they promote good behaviour by having clear rules and expectations. They say they encourage children to talk about how they feel and help them learn to resolve disputes for themselves.
- Leaders understand the importance of positive partnerships with parents. They explain how they share information about the provision and keep parents informed about their child's care. For example, as well as verbal handovers when children arrive or are collected, staff share information by text, email and online.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
