Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Staff provide a clean and well-organised environment. They understand the procedures they need to follow to keep children safe in the setting. Staff explain how they promote healthy lifestyles by providing opportunities for children to undertake a range of physical activities outside and by providing a range of healthy and nutritious snacks and meals.
- Staff gather information about children's individual needs from parents when they start at the setting. They understand how to use this information to make sure that children's dietary and medical needs are met. Staff also find out about any special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND). Staff understand the importance of working with parents and schools to meet the needs of SEND children.
- Staff explain the importance of supporting children to develop positive relationships with each other, and ensuring children have a key person with whom they can develop a trusting relationship. Staff discuss the strategies they use to promote positive behaviour, such as offering children time to calm down and discussing the reasons for their behaviour. Staff also create colourful reward charts, which help children to monitor their own behaviour.
- Staff explain how they provide a range of activities and opportunities that challenge children and help them develop new skills. They plan activities such as dodge ball and limbo as well as creative activities, such as making flags and learning about other countries. Staff understand the importance of offering children opportunities that enrich their learning and build resilience.
- Managers evaluate the setting and continually take action to improve the provision. They provide staff with a thorough induction and offer ongoing support to help them develop their skills. Managers understand the importance of keeping their own knowledge up to date and continually cascade this to staff through meaningful training to ensure staff are confident and knowledgeable.
- Managers have a clear focus on safeguarding children. They ensure their policies and procedures are up to date and that staff are kept fully informed. Staff are knowledgeable about how to recognise a child is at risk of abuse and the actions they need to take. They also understand their responsibilities to follow the whistle-blowing procedure if they have concerns about other adults working with children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
