

Complaint about childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 8 August and 27 October 2025, the provider notified us about, safeguarding policies and procedures, staff: child ratios, safeguarding training and safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage' to notify Ofsted of significant events.

On 10 November 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider has refreshed staff's knowledge and understanding of the setting's safeguarding procedures. In particular, the importance of referring safeguarding concerns without delay. This means staff know and understand their responsibilities in keeping children safe. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
