

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 28 August 2025 we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements related to safeguarding policies and procedures, suitable people, supervision of staff, staff: child ratios, safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment.

On 3 September 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have served a welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 15 September 2025:

- 1) make sure all staff understand and follow the nursery procedures for preventing unauthorised persons from accessing the premises

Actions needed by 31 October 2025:

- 1) provide renewed safeguarding training for staff who hold designated safeguarding lead responsibility, so they follow the correct procedure when responding to any safeguarding concerns that occur at the setting
- 2) improve leaders' understanding of matters that must be reported to Ofsted and the timescale for notification.

On 7 November 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their regulatory event. We found the provider had ensured all staff understand and follow the correct procedures for checking visitors before allowing them entry to the nursery. Staff with designated safeguarding responsibilities have completed training to strengthen their understanding of managing safeguarding concerns and notifications to Ofsted.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
