Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The management team have a robust safer recruitment procedure in place and carry out checks on all staff to ensure they are suitable to work with children. In-depth training and induction is provided for new staff, ensuring they are confident and competent in their new roles. Regular supervision is offered to provide staff with opportunities to reflect on their practice and identify strengths, weaknesses and training needs.
- There are robust procedures in place to record accidents and the administration of medication. Staff record this information securely online. The system also alerts the management and allows them to monitor these procedures and identify concerns easily, helping to keep children safe.
- The management team is passionate about sports and exercise. Staff understand the importance of providing regular sporting activities that support children's physical development, team work and social skills. They will ensure younger children access the outdoors every day to promote children's well-being and health. Additionally, staff understand the importance of providing healthy foods and will encourage young children to get involved with the preparation of snack time.
- The club works incredibly closely with the school. They have developed good partnership working and share information to enable them to provide a high standard of care. Additionally, staff work closely with teachers to support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities and intend to provide a variety of opportunities that meet younger children's needs.
- Staff have clear rules and boundaries in place and share these with children to ensure they have a good understanding of the behavioural expectations at the club. Staff plan to use these rules to teach early years children about respect and kindness, supporting their social interactions and positive attitudes.
- Staff intend to provide children with a range of learning opportunities during their time at the club. This includes learning about a variety of festivals and events, such as Christmas and Luna New Year. Staff understand the importance of developing children's understanding of different cultures and religions.
- Through discussions, the management demonstrates their good understanding of the importance of the key-person role. All early years children are allocated a key person within the setting to develop and support strong relationships. This will enable staff to get to know younger children well and support their transition into the club.
- Robust risk assessments are carried out to ensure the setting is safe and secure for all children. There are ample measures taken to ensure children's safety. For example, staff update and adapt risk assessments depending on their location or the type of activity children will be experiencing. Staff understand the importance of providing a range of equipment and resources that are suitable for the age range of children who attend.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
