Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders demonstrate a clear understanding of the importance of gathering detailed information about children before they begin attending the club. They share this information with key staff to ensure that children's individual needs are met, and their safety is maintained. This includes details about children's dietary and medical requirements. Leaders and staff use this information to offer healthy, nutritious meals to children.
- Leaders demonstrate a good understanding of the importance of providing a variety of activities that suit the individual needs and interests of children. They discuss planning for sports activities that promote the development of new skills. Leaders and staff promote opportunities for children to explore quiet activities indoors. These include spaces to relax and explore construction and craft activities.
- Leaders explain the importance of supporting staff through regular assessments and opportunities for further training and development. They are committed to supporting their team to learn and grow. Leaders routinely reflect on practice and accurately identify areas for improvement. They explain the plans that they have in place to further develop positive engagement.
- Staff express their gratitude for the ongoing support for their well-being. They share that they feel supported and that they have opportunities for future career progression. Staff report positive recruitment processes and rigorous checks on their suitability to work with children.
- Leaders promote the importance of an inclusive setting, where children's needs are recognised and supported. They share how they celebrate each child as an individual and support the development of cooperative play. Leaders and staff demonstrate a good understanding of how to provide children with choices and the development of independence.
- Leaders understand the importance of developing strong links with parents so that they forge positive communication about children. They explain how they share information with parents about activities that children take part in and how they invite information from parents about children's experiences. Parents are encouraged to regularly update leaders on any changes to children's information and to share feedback on the club. They use this information to consistently improve the service that they offer.
- Leaders create effective risk assessments to promote the safety of children. They demonstrate understanding of how to maintain children's safety and how to ensure that equipment is safe. They explain the daily checks that they complete and how they supervise children at play.
- Leaders promote positive behaviour strategies. They explain policies and training that provide staff with knowledge and skills in supporting children's behaviour. Leaders and staff understand the importance of setting clear boundaries and acting as positive role models for children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
