

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 22 August 2025, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements.

The report and inspection outcome will be published in due course. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 9 September 2025. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 19 September 2025:

- implement a key-person system that ensures each child's care is tailored to meet their individual needs, offers a settled relationship for the child, and builds a relationship with their parents and/or carers
- ensure that information is shared with parents and carers about their child's development and who their key person is
- ensure that safeguarding policies and procedures are implemented to keep children safe
- ensure that individuals with lead safeguarding roles have secure skills and knowledge to recognise, understand and respond to concerns about children
- implement effective procedures so that all staff can support children with special educational needs and/or disabilities (SEND) to make good progress in their learning
- implement effective and consistent strategies to manage children's behaviour, which help children understand what staff expect of them

On 23 September 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that all children had been allocated a key person and parents are informed of this. The provider had reviewed their safeguarding policies and procedures and

strengthened staff and leaders' understanding of implementing these policies. The provider arranged training sessions to improve staff's knowledge about supporting children with special educational needs and disabilities and understanding children's behaviour. We are satisfied that the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
