

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 February 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safeguarding policies and procedures, concerns about children's safety and welfare, suitable people, and staff: child ratios. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant incident.

On 16 March 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. The provider had reviewed their safeguarding policies and procedures to ensure any safeguarding referrals are made without delay and in line with local safeguarding partnership guidance. They had revised their risk assessments and arrangements for visitors who attend the site to ensure procedures are robust and keep children safe. This included developing clear guidelines for staff to follow in the event of any visitors to site, as well as maintaining an accurate record of any visitor's attendance. In addition, they had taken steps to ensure children are always supervised, this included not allowing visitors unsupervised access to children.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
