Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders are aware of their responsibilities to ensure that all staff have robust safeguarding knowledge. They provide staff with relevant training to keep their knowledge up to date. Staff are confident in the signs and indicators of abuse and fully understand the procedures to follow if they have any child protection concerns.
- Leaders know the importance of maintaining communication with parents, which helps them understand about children's backgrounds and individual needs. They encourage feedback from parents and children to help them shape and improve the club.
- Leaders and staff know how to provide a play environment that includes all children. Staff explain that the daily routines they have designed enables them to structure the sessions so that children have access to a range of experiences.
- Leaders and staff understand how to promote children's health. For example, they explain the provision is clean and provide nutritious snacks and meals for the children to enjoy.
- Leaders understand how to support children's behaviour. They discuss previous experience of working in partnership with children's school and implement similar visual aids to support children's behaviour. Staff have agreed rules with the children to help them understand the behaviour expectations.
- Leaders talk about how they carry out regular audits on the club to ensure that appropriate resources and staffing are in place. They also use feedback from children, parents and staff to inform their evaluations of the quality of the provision.
- Leaders have a good understanding of the requirements of registration. They keep themselves up to date with any changes, such as subscribing to relevant updates from the local authority.
- Leaders have robust recruitment and supervision in place, to ensure that staff are suitable for their role. Effective policies and procedures are in place and implemented well. Leaders understands the importance of offering staff ongoing training opportunities to enhance and support their professional development.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
