

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 5 February and 16 April 2026, the provider notified us about matters relating to safety and suitability of premises, environment and equipment. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event which is likely to affect the suitability of the provider. On 11 February and 26 March 2026, we received concerns about matters relating to the same requirements.

On 21 April 2026, we received further concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to staff: child ratios, risk assessments and supporting and understanding children's behaviour.

On 17 April 2026, we carried out a regulatory visit. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 1 May 2026:

- deploy staff effectively to meet children's individual and learning needs
- ensure staffing arrangements keep children safe and that children are always adequately

supervised

Actions needed by 26 June 2026:

- train staff to improve their understanding of how to support and manage children's behaviour.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 8 May 2026, the provider responded to the actions set. We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
