The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- Staff develop secure partnership with parents and professionals who share responsibility for the care and development of the children. This supports consistency in children's learning and well-being.
- The premises are safe, secure and well-equipped to meet the needs of the children attending the club.
- The staff have safeguarding training prior to working with the children. Daily checks of the building enable staff to minimise risks.
- Management and staff use self-evaluation to help them make continued improvements for the benefit of children. The record keeping systems are well kept and informative.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed areas of the school accessed by the out of school club, including the outdoor environment.
- The inspector discussed with children the activities they enjoyed participating in.
- The inspector checked evidence of suitability and qualifications of staff working with the children.
- The inspector carried out a meeting with the manager and looked at and discussed a range of policies and procedures.
- The inspector interviewed three parents and their views taken into account.

Information about the setting

Cherry Tree Kids Club registered in 2008. It operates from Crook Log Primary School, in Bexleyheath, Kent. It is one of a number of out of school provisions, privately managed by Cherry Tree Nursery Limited. Children have access to one hall and two enclosed outdoor play areas, including the school field.

The provider is registered on the Early Years Register and on both the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. The club currently supports children with special educational needs and/or disabilities and children who speak English as an additional language. There are currently 32 children on roll, at the time of the inspection there were no children present in the early years age group. The setting opens five days per week from 3.15 pm until 6 pm during school term times. The club run a breakfast club each week day from 7.45am.

The club employs five members of staff. All staff hold a recognised early years qualification at National Vocational Qualification level 2 and 3.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
