Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Leaders demonstrate a sound knowledge of how to support children's learning through providing varied activities. They plan for children to learn about different countries over the duration of the holiday club. Leaders intend for them to gain purposeful learning from this, such as to say a few words from a different language or make a recipe they have enjoyed.
- Leaders have a clear understanding of the importance of providing children with plenty of opportunities to promote a healthy lifestyle. Leaders explain their passion for supplying children with a variety of choices for lunchtimes and involving them in making their own meals. The purpose of this is to initiate conversations about nutrition and encourage children to try new foods.
- Leaders explain how they intend to involve children's views in different aspects of the holiday club, such as planning activities and creating the rules together. They also have high expectations for children's communication and language development and focus on staff's understanding of this during training.
- Leaders have an in-depth knowledge of how to safely recruit staff who are suitable to work with children. They conduct rigorous employment checks and request further suitability checks at the commencement of each holiday period.
- Leaders explain their knowledge of the importance of safeguarding. They discuss how they ensure all staff receive regular training, such as county lines and 'Prevent' duty training, to keep their knowledge relevant and up to date. Through discussions and team meetings, leaders frequently check staff knowledge of how to identify a child who may have become victim of abuse.
- Leaders clearly understand the importance of working with parents and professionals. They explain how they work closely with the local authority and family support workers, especially where children have special educational needs and/or disabilities. Leaders know how to share information to ensure all children are supported in achieving the very best outcomes.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
