

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

On 22 September 2025, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. The provision was judged to be inadequate. The inspection report sets out the actions the provider was required to take to meet the requirements.

On 15 October 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection. We found that the provider had not met the actions raised at the inspection. We therefore served a further welfare requirements notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 14 November 2025:

- demonstrate that leaders and staff can identify and minimise hazards to children to support their safety and well-being
- demonstrate how staffing arrangements can meet the needs of all children, so that their emotional well-being is always supported
- demonstrate how leaders and staff manage behaviour, with a focus on promoting consistent, positive approaches
- demonstrate that individuals with lead safeguarding roles and staff have secure skills and knowledge to recognise, understand and respond to concerns about children.

During the regulatory visit, we believed children may be at risk of harm. As a result, we suspended the provider's registration. Suspension allows time for the provider to take steps to reduce or eliminate the risk of harm to children. The provider has a right to appeal against a suspension. The provider may not provide childcare for which registration is required while the suspension is in place and may commit an offence if they do so.

On 17 November 2025, we conducted a regulatory visit. During the visit the provider notified us of their wish to resign their registration. They are no longer a registered childcare provider.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
