

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 23 September 2022, the provider notified us that a child had been left unattended inside the nursery. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 10 October 2022, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 25 October 2022:

- ensure all staff receive appropriate induction training and ongoing training opportunities to help them effectively fulfil their roles and responsibilities and meet children's individual needs
- improve the arrangements for the supervision of staff to ensure that the manager has a clear understanding of the necessary coaching and training staff require to improve their practice
- ensure all staff, including those with lead responsibility, are aware of and follow the local safeguarding partnership's procedures for reporting concerns about children's welfare, with particular regard to allegations being against a member of staff
- improve systems for sharing information with parents to ensure significant events relating to children are shared with parents without delay.

We will monitor the provider's response to ensure the actions are successfully completed.

On 24 October 2022, the provider responded to the actions set. We found that the provider had improved induction, training and staff supervision processes. They had improved their knowledge and understanding of child protection procedures and now fully understands their responsibilities. The provider has also developed their procedures for sharing

information with parents.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years.
