

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at <http://www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2>. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 20 May 2025, the provider notified us about matters relating to health and, qualifications training and skills. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage to notify Ofsted of a significant event.

On 21 May 2025 we received concerns that the provider was not meeting requirements relating to health, key person, safety and suitability of the premises, equipment and environment and, information and record keeping.

On 26 and 30 June 2024, we carried out regulatory telephone calls. We found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements and had taken action to put this right. Staff have completed training on how to support children with asthma. A review of the procedures for the administering of medication has been completed and these now includes where children's medication is to be stored at the setting and who is to administer medication.

We also found the provider was not meeting some of the requirements. We have issued actions for the provider to take. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Action needed by 7 July 2025:

- ensure that medication forms accurately record each medication that is to be administered to children and that staff are trained in the effective completion of all medication documentation
- ensure risk assessment procedures are fully effective, and staff demonstrate knowledge and understanding of how to identify and remove any risks

On 3 July 2025, the provider responded to the required actions. We found that the provider had revised the setting's medication and risk assessment policy and procedures. A member of the management team now oversees all medication administration and the completion of relevant documentation. Furthermore, all staff had completed training in drug administration

and risk assessment. These new procedures ensures that children's medication is stored securely and does not pose a risk to children.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.
