Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- Staff explain the opportunities children have to share their thoughts, wishes and feelings. Staff explain that children are individually encouraged to express how they feel as they arrive at the club, following a day in school. Staff also explain an additional system is being created so that children can share their views about the club in writing.
- Staff demonstrate that the children who attend are encouraged to feel as relaxed as they can. Staff explain that they support relationships between the children and their peers and strongly promote relationships between the older and younger children. Staff explain some of the older children relish the opportunity to support and look after the younger children who attend.
- Staff describe a strong emphasis on providing inclusive practice. They comment on how all children are made to feel valued and part of the group. Staff describe secure arrangements to care for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. Staff explain how both older and younger children have opportunities to participate in debates about the planning of the following week's activities. Staff describe how they sometimes intervene to guide these sessions in order that all voices are heard.
- Staff describe how children's behaviour is managed. They explain that they spend time with children to find out why they are behaving in a challenging way or completely out of character. They comment this helps them to understand the root cause and suggest mechanisms of how they can behave better. Staff discuss how children themselves are involved in how to resolve conflict.
- Staff describe how they join in with the children's games and model language. They explain the development of the youngest children is discussed with class teachers in the host school. Staff explain how they complement the curriculum taught in school and provide activities to build on what children know and can do.
- Staff describe some of the activities they provide. They explain that younger children enjoy looking at activities that they have been involved in and creating a timeline of photographs. Staff explain children have opportunities to work together with their peers and be a team member in small group competitions. For example, erecting tall structures and models from marshmallows and pasta. Staff explain how they adapt activities to present some children with more challenge and simplify others, in order to ensure all children have opportunities to achieve and believe in themselves.
- Arrangements are in place to work in partnership with parents. Staff describe how they find out from children's parents the care their children require, including their likes and dislikes. Staff also explain that they make parents aware of who to contact in the event of a concern about the club or the service they receive.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
