

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage, which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 27 February 2025, we carried out an inspection and found the provider was not meeting some of these requirements. Following the inspection, we served a welfare requirements notice on 13 March 2025. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed by 10 March 2025

- ensure Ofsted is provided with all the necessary information required to complete suitability checks of all individuals associated with the management committee, in a timely manner

Actions needed by 21 April 2025

- ensure all staff and committee members have a robust and secure knowledge of local safeguarding procedures so that children's safety and well-being are assured
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- implement effective supervision and coaching for staff and monitor their practice to improve teaching so that all children benefit from high-quality interactions and receive meaningful and purposeful learning experiences
- ensure that there are effective arrangements in place for children with special educational needs and/or disabilities so that all staff implement strategies and understand individual targets to fully support children's learning and development
- ensure staff support children who speak English as an additional language to develop their understanding of English alongside their home language.

On 17 March 2025, we carried out a regulatory telephone call. The focus of the call was to check whether the provider had met the safeguarding and welfare action raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had provided Ofsted with the necessary information to complete suitability checks on all individuals associated with the setting.

On 24 April 2025, we carried out a regulatory visit. The focus of the visit was to check whether the provider had met the remaining safeguarding and welfare actions raised at their last inspection.

We found that the provider had taken steps to address the actions raised. Staff and individuals associated with the setting have attended training to improve their knowledge and understanding of local safeguarding procedures. Arrangements for the supervision and coaching of staff have been implemented to help improve their personal effectiveness and to support all children that attend the setting.

We are satisfied the provider has met the safeguarding and welfare actions raised. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.
