Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The manager and staff team are experienced and well qualified. They know how to plan and provide a range of activities that builds on children's interests and complements their learning in school.
- The manager has a good understanding of her role and responsibility to keep children safe and protected from harm. Staff are aware of the possible indicators of abuse and know the procedure to follow to report any concerns about the welfare of a child. All staff undertake regular training to help them keep their knowledge and skills up to date.
- Staff understand how to positively manage children's behaviour. They are aware that children need to have clear boundaries to help guide and promote their positive behaviour.
- The manager recognises the importance of working in partnership with parents and the school to help support the ongoing care and learning of the children.
- The manager understands the importance of promoting children's awareness of healthy lifestyles. Staff provide healthy snacks and encourage children to be physically active.
- The manager demonstrates a strong commitment to the continual development of the club. Parents', staff's and children's views are considered when evaluating the provision. The club also receive support and advice from the local authority adviser.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector had discussions with the provider and manager about the provision of care for the children and had a tour of the areas used by children at the club.
- The inspector held discussions with the manager and staff. She checked evidence of the suitability of staff working with the children.
- The inspector sampled a range of documentation, including policies and procedures, staff records and risk assessment.
