Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider of the club, understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. For example, she ensures her staff have completed safeguarding training to help with identifying any safeguarding issues and reporting any child protection concerns to appropriate agencies. The provider discussed how she implements ongoing procedures to assess staff suitability and encourages staff's professional knowledge and skills.
- The provider understands the importance of supporting children's growing independence, and promoting children's physical development and a healthy lifestyle.
- The provider has a good understanding of how to promote children's emotional well-being and positive relationships. She is aware of positive behaviour management, and describes how she supports children's good behaviour. The provider encourages children to understand the consequences of their actions, and to be kind and respectful to others. She also understands how to support children to develop respect for others different to themselves.
- The provider understands the benefits of working closely with parents and the schools that children attend to promote continuity of children's learning and care.
- The provider knows how to reflect on the quality of her own and her staffs' practice to identify areas for further development. There are effective systems in place to evaluate all aspects of the provision and continually make improvements to benefit children.
- The provider understands the importance of creating a welcoming environment for children. She ensures the setting has a range of equipment, resources and toys to meet the needs and interests of different age groups of children. She understands the importance of an inclusive setting.
- The provider recognises the importance of carrying out risk assessments. She ensures staff carry out regular risk assessments of the setting to ensure the safety of children. Children are provided with a safe and secure environment to play and learn in.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
